


A simple guide to RSN online spreadsheets - Civil Service Employment as a Percentage of working age population (Aged 16-64)

Civil Service Employment¹ can be an important element of a local authority's economy. This analysis looks at the changing picture in your area compared to the rural/urban averages. To select the authority of interest, please follow these steps:

Using the mouse, left click on the cell containing an authority name.



Clicking this time on the grey square with a blue triangle to present the drop down list of options, use the scroll bar to find the authority of interest before selecting that authority.
