


A simple guide to RSN online spreadsheets – Car Ownership (Census 2011)

Census 2011 data relating to car or van availability allowed a simple calculation that demonstrated that rural households generally own more vehicles than urban households. This is intuitively obvious since without a vehicle, rural dwellers can be isolated and unable to access the services, the employment opportunities, and activities that most people take for granted. This in turn increases the financial burden on a rural household due to both the initial purchase of the vehicle but also its' associated running costs.

The analysis presents the average number of cars or vans per household for rural and urban communities, and also allows the user to select their local authority of interest.

To select from this list, please follow these instructions:



Using your mouse, select the cell highlighted with a dashed border.

Clicking on the grey square with a blue triangle presents the full list of authorities from which to select. Use the scroll bar to the side of the authority names to move up or down the list.
