


A simple guide to RSN online spreadsheets – Road Accidents & Safety Analysis


The Department for Transport makes available a series of road safety statistics. The Road Accidents & Safety Analysis presents the 2011 statistics for member authorities, and hopefully provides a view of that authority's particular situation in comparison to other similar authorities and the rural/urban position. The number of incidents in each case are presented as a percentage of usual resident population, and it is these that are ranked.

The spreadsheet uses three drop down lists to select the authority of interest, the relative seriousness of the incident, and the mode of transport for which statistics are required. The analysis then presents a bar chart showing the authorities position against rural and urban averages, the ranking of the authority on this statistic against similarly rural authorities, and the ten highest authorities for the measure selected.

(NB. Within the spreadsheet, KSI is used as an abbreviation of 'Killed or Seriously Injured')



A scroll bar to the right of the list allows you to navigate to the authority of interest. Click on the authority name to see the relevant statistics.
